Annual Conference Luncheon: "Left on the Vine"

This year Carol Wise, the Executive Director of Brethren Mennonite Council for LGBT Interests, will be our featured speaker. Her talk titled, "Left on the Vine", will cover the undervalue of women within the church.



Carol has a long history with Caucus, having served on the Steering Committee and as the Convener for several years. Highlights for her during her time on the Steering Committee include the Women Doing Theology Conference, Dancing at the Wall and Dancing at the Water's Edge Conferences, and the invitation to Martin Rock to speak at the Annual Conference Caucus luncheon. Carol currently lives in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and worships with the Common Spirit Minneapolis congregation. We are very much looking forward to seeing those of you who will join us in person in Tampa, Florida and feeling the support from the wider community of Womaen's Caucus.

Annual Conference Insight Session

We would like to highlight the insight session at Annual Conference called Moving Beyond Shame—Spiritual Care for Survivors of Domestic Violence which will be co-facilitated by Laura Whitman and Kathy Gingrich. This session will focus on living through abuse and manipulation, many domestic violence survivors feel an array of emotions, including shame, guild, anger and self-blame. In a society that is prone to blame the victim, abuse survivors need churches and clergy that do not perpetuate blame. Resolving spiritual distress through guidance and spiritual care promotes healing. At this insight session we will take about what churches can do to help these women and men, including discussing the spiritual questions that may weigh on their minds., resources that churches can use, and how congregations can create a service of healing for survivors. It will take place on Sunday, July 12th from 9 to 10pm in Room 20.

Let the Spirit Move Us

I want the spirit to move at annual conference. I sit with my Grandma and my Mother at these gatherings waiting for God to speak through those around me. I look to those microphones on the floor, hopeful every time to hear the spirit and feel the love of God come through those words. In the Brethren church we often don't look to our officials and office bearers for leadership as we don't want to consolidate power. So I expect the power of the spirit on the floor.

The 2014 conference was moderated by Nancy Sollenberger, with the last female moderator being Belita Mitchell in 2007. I spent much of last year's conference taking note of who went up to the microphones on the floor of conference. Based on a majority of the business sessions (a half hour of unfinished business 1 - Ministerial leadership - and a bit of during or after the Climate Change debate was missed), and I made some assumptions about gender presentation and secondary sex characteristics. I recorded a list of the gender of microphone speakers. By my counting men spoke at the microphones 2/3rds of the time at the 2014 Annual Conference.

Now, I don't think the spirit is moving more in men then it is in women, nor do I think it moves less in the queer and non-binary folks I know. Men speaking at the microphones more is probably due to social enculturation.

From paying so much attention I found I noticed new things:

I was most offended when a young man came up and said he spoke for the young people. Who was he representing? Did he have their consent? I know that I personally have done that before reading a document that was generated from a young adult meeting, and while it was not perfect it was from collaboration and there was a majority of consent or blessing for the content. (The statement was about unity in being not of one mind in 2012.)

There are also people who come up to the microphone multiple times, maybe 3-4 folk speaking 2-3 times. And I thought about how I sensor myself, only trying to speak once at annual conference if I feel called. Some of the repeats came from the table set-up. People were empowered by their table to go the microphone and speak. Speakers show what is possible and what is acceptable on the floor of conference.

I want to encourage people to be engaged in the conference discussion. At annual conference all members are equal and blessed with ministry, and anyone who feels called should come to the microphone to speak. And to help this is how you start: "Sister/Brother Moderator, I am ____, and I am from the ____ Church from the ____ district, and I am speaking" in favor or of against or about such and such topic.

I know some of us are more comfortable with public speaking, some more shy, but really if you are concerned about the business item ask some friends near by, practice what you want to say, and speak up if you can. For those of us who step up more often it still doesn't hurt to share and improve our message with the help of the gathered. Women, or women leaning folk, I invite you to join me in participating, in engaging, in growing this church though our love and care.

Womaen's Caucus at NOAC

This year Womaen's Caucus is delighted to be leading an interest group at this year's National Older Adult Conference. Our group is titled **What is your Story?** We will be exploring women's stories within the Bible and looking at them in conjunction with our own stories of being women in the church. NOAC will take place at Lake Junaluska in North Carolina on September 7th through the 11th.


Who is God, Anyway

I cannot argue for a moment that God is not real. We cannot see God, but we do have the reality of the Godpresence every day. No human words, no human formulas and no human religious systems will ever capture that reality fully.

We can speak of God only in human words. We have no other. But we can see where God has been. We will note again: that the God of the Hebrew Testament is said to have "walked with Adam and Eve in the cool of the evening," to have warned Noah to prepare for the coming flood by building an ark, to have chosen Abraham to be the father of a new people, to have called and led Moses in being the agent of freedom from slavery. We here note again: the God-presence in Jesus who brought a whole new concept of living to humans as detailed in the Christian Testament. Church history has brought an insight into human progress in developing their religious systems, along with highs and lows, as humans progressed through the periods of reformation, reason and scientific development. Our present time along with our decisions in our religious life, can bring progress or stalemate. I believe God is waiting for us to seize opportunities to be the presenters of the God-presence. Only as we go forward meaningfully and with depth, will we be able to open to humanity the fullness of the God-presence in meeting the challenges in our living, and in our world.

We can experience God by being communitarian. We can know God by sharing God's love without boundaries. The reality of the God-presence is touchable and reachable as we search, listen, and respond.
