But I believe it also teaches us what it means to live out a radical love for one another. Truly embodying Christ's call to love one another often requires us to do things that make no sense to other people. But it makes sense to God. As more and more people find themselves displaced or just out of place in this world, I am prayerfully struggling to find ways to live out Christ's call to love and to anoint the journeys of my brothers and sisters. Genesis 3:21 "The LORD God made garments of skin for Adam and his wife, and clothed them. Woven into our story of creation and "fall", God **anticipates** and makes provision for our needs. Despite the "eviction" notice from the Garden of Eden, God "clothes" us with the ability to go on. God's clothing us includes giving us both physical and emotional "skins". 
